The National Archives and Records Administration (NARA) has received your report regarding the missing records from a Special Needs Program Case File. We understand that the Base Cape Cod Family Resource Specialist mailed an individual personnel paper case file containing medical and personal identification information used for enrollment and case management in the Special Needs Program to the HQ Special Needs Program Manager (SNPM) via the United States Postal Service Priority Registered Mail. When received, it was discovered that the shipping list did not match the contents of the container and one record was determined to be missing.

We acknowledge that the information in the record cannot be recreated and there is no duplicate copy of this record available. In order to mitigate future incidents, we understand that this program will no longer mail closed records to the USCG prior to their destruction. Instead the files will be maintained and destroyed at the operational units based on the disposition authority N1-026-07-9.
