IMPORTANT NOTE

The document that follows is the filing manual issued by the Department of State in November 1948 to control the filing of records at American Foreign Service Posts. Ultimately, it covered records from the period 1949 through 1963.

Preservation of records depended upon whether the post creating and maintaining the records was a diplomatic post or a consular post.

For **Diplomatic Posts** in general the following records were designated for preservation:

- File 050: Prominent Persons
- Class 3: Political and Governmental Affairs
- Class 5: Economic, Industrial, and Social Affairs.

At seven special diplomatic posts (Sofia, Bulgaria; Prague, Czechoslovakia; Budapest, Hungary; Warsaw, Poland; Bucharest, Romania; Belgrade, Yugoslavia; and Moscow, U.S.S.R.) the following additional files were designated as permanent:

- File 030: Visits and Tours
- File 040: Entertainment, Ceremonials and Ceremonial Communications, Condolences, Felicitation
- File 100: Administration-General
- File 120: Foreign Service of the United States
- File 200: Citizenship, Immigration, Protective and Legal Services-General
- File 220: Citizenship and Passport Matters (General)
- File 230: Protection and Welfare Services.

From **Consular Posts** the following files were designated for preservation:

- File 050: Prominent Persons
- File 310: International Conferences and Organizations
- File 510: Trade Relations

In some cases records designated for preservation were mistakenly destroyed and some records designated as temporary were preserved.



USE OF THE RECORDS CLASSIFICATION HANDBOOK

PURPOSE OF THE HANDBOOK

The Records Classification Handbook contains the basic standardized classification numbers for filing of the correspondence, documents, and records of the Foreign Service posts. All correspondence, documents, and records dated subsequent to December 31, 1948, shall be classified and filed in accordance with this handbook.

CLASSES

The records classification numbers are grouped in seven classes. Class 0 is a general or miscellaneous class, and is reserved for records not satisfactorily classifiable elsewhere and for matters of an inconsequential nature. The other six classes are functional groupings of the activities of the Foreign Service. They are:

- Class 1 Administration.
- Class 2 Citizenship. Immigration. Protective and Legal Services.
- Class 3 Political and Governmental Affairs.
- Class 4 National Defense Affairs.
- Class 5 Economic, Industrial, and Social Affairs.
- Class 6 Informational, Cultural, and Scientific Affairs.

Subjects having more than one aspect have been assigned to the class having primary application from the point of view of Foreign Service operations. Unless otherwise noted, all subjects cover both United States and foreign activities and affairs. Subjects should be broken down into alphabetical country files as needed. Likewise, both the internal and international phases of subjects are embraced unless there is qualifying language to the contrary.

BASIS OF THE FILE NUMBERS

The individual file numbers within each class are based on a decimal numbering system. This system classifies by tenths. Each number is composed of three digits to the left of the decimal point, and additional digits or tenths are added to the right of the decimal point to provide further subclassifications. The first digit of each number identifies the class. That is, the file number 100 indicates that it is within Class 1, Administration.

SUBJECT CLASSIFICATIONS

Each class has been subdivided into file classification subjects, in the same manner that one prepares a topical or subject outline. The first level of subdivision of a class is identified by the second digit of the file number. Thus Class 2 has been subdivided into the following major subject classifications, each identified by the second digit:

- 200 General.
- 210 Immigration and Emigration. Travel Control.
- 220 Citizenship and Passport Matters.
- 230 Protection and Welfare Services.
- 240 U.S. Veterans' and Pensions Services
- 250 Legal Services.
- 270 Consular Invoice Services.
- 280 Shipping Services.
- 290 Seamen Services.

SUB-CLASSIFICATIONS

Under certain of these subject classifications further classifications have been provided. Thus, under 220 Citizenship and Passport Matters, the following subject classifications appear, each identified by the third digit:

- 221 Citizenship of the United States.
- 222 Citizenship (non-United States).

Their relationship to the major subject classification continues to be indicated by the retention of the same second digit. In like manner further classifications have been provided under general classifications through the addition of numbers to the right of the decimal point in the usual manner. For example, the following subclassifications appear under classification 221:

- 221.1 Children born abroad to American parents.
- 221.2 Marriage of American citizens abroad.

Thus certain aspects of citizenship may be filed under file number 221.1, others under 221, and still others under 220, depending upon the specific content of the individual documents.

USE OF INDEX

A detailed index has been provided only as a guide in finding the proper classification. The text of the classification listing itself must be carefully examined to determine its appropriateness before the file number is assigned. The file number of the first subject classification appearing on each page is indicated at the top right corner of each page.

USE BY INDIVIDUAL POSTS

As much of the terminology and grouping of the 1924 edition of the Foreign Service Classification of Correspondence has been salvaged in the revised classification handbook as was feasible. The assignment of file numbers to secondary subject classifications has been more limited to provide greater flexibility in the application of the handbook to the requirements of the individual posts. Whenever material to be filed properly belongs under a subject classification to which file number has been assigned in this handbook, a file folder numbered and labeled in accordance with the listing in the handbook must be established. Additional file folders may be established for the unnumbered subject

classifications appearing in the handbook or for such other classifications as may be pertinent at an individual post. Such folders shall also bear the file number to which they are related and shall be filed alphabetically behind the listed numbered file. Thus, if any post desires a further breakdown of 221 Citizenship of the United States than is provided, it may establish file folders entitled 221 Naturalization, 221 Citizenship of married women, or with any other subheadings as the needs of the post may dictate. (See also explanatory note No. 1) Decimal file numbers may not be added for such classifications.

DEPARTMENT FILE NUMBERS NOT TO BE USED AS GUIDE

Under the 1924 classification system, the file numbers used in the Department had the same basis as those prescribed for the Foreign Service. This relationship has not been retained in the development of the present handbook. Consequently, the file number appearing on documents from the Department usually will be at variance with the numbers prescribed for the filing of such documents by the Foreign Service posts. However, the Department's Manual, now under preparation, is being designed along similar lines.



EXPLANATORY NOTES

(1) Subjects that involve both abstract and individual case correspondence (such as 123 Personnel and most of the headings in Class 2) should be broken down into general and alphabetical name files. For example, 221 Citizenship should be subdivided into 221 General for abstract correspondence on citizenship matters, followed by alphabetical name files on individuals with regard to whom citizenship matters arise. Wherever practicable, name files should cover all phases of the primary subject as it affects the individual, regardless of the fact that the general correspondence may be divided into several subtitles.

The alphabetical name files under 123 should include all correspondence concerning officers and employees as individuals, including speeches and public statements. When of sufficient importance, cross-reference subjectively.

(2) 120 Foreign Service of the United States and its subheadings, other than 128, are intended both for administration of the post itself (without regard to its class) and for the administration of the Foreign Service as a whole. Administrative services rendered by the post to other United States Government representatives in the accredited country and to the Foreign Service posts outside its supervisory territory should be filed in 128.

(3) 120.2 Administration of consular offices in accredited country is for use in supervisory post only, for its administrative relations with subordinate consular offices, including copies of correspondence between such offices and the Department of State on administrative matters. Copies of other correspondence received by the supervisory post from consular offices in its supervisory jurisdiction will be filed under the appropriate subject in the same manner as similar correspondence initiated by the supervisory post.

(4) 121 Security, Security Measures. Security problems and measures that are an integral part of an administrative service may be filed subjectively, and, if of sufficient importance, cross-referenced to 121. This would be particularly applicable to courier services (125.3) and cryptographic matters (125.21).

(5) 251 Extradition. This section also includes cases in which prosecution of a person in one country for a crime committed in another is proposed or requested.

(6) 310 International Conferences and Organizations. Conventions and meetings not having the character or scope of an international conference should be filed subjectively.

(7) 320 International Political Relations. File alphabetically by countries where possible, likewise arranging the names of countries in the headings in alphabetical order, thus: China-United States; Germany-Russia; United States-Venezuela. In the case of multilateral negotiations list alphabetically in heading only a sufficient number

of the countries involved to indicate proper filing arrangement, followed by et al,

(8) 320.1 Treaties. Pacts. Multilateral and Bilateral. Includes interpretation of treaties, as well as the treaties themselves. However, application of treaties should be filed under the appropriate subject. Thus extradition treaties are filed under 320.14; general correspondence and individual cases concerning extradition are filed in 251.

(9) 321 War. Peace. Friendship. Alliance. This section covers matters that arise only in connection with war. Correspondence concerning the military establishments, both in time of war and peace, will be filed in Class 4; protection and welfare services, both war- and peace-time, in the 230 series.

(10) 361 Executive Branch. Subheadings should be established under 361.2 and 361.3 covering files for Government agencies as needed, such as 361.2 U.S. Treasury Department, 361.3 U.S. Civil Service Commission, 361.2 Chile Foreign Office.

These headings are intended for correspondence concerning the organization and functions of the respective agencies, other than the U.S. Department of State, for which 110 has been provided, as well as routine services rendered to these agencies not justifying a subjective classification. (See 020 for transmittal of publications to U.S. Government agencies.) Actual operations of Government agencies should be filed under the appropriate subject, and if the volume of correspondence justifies, a special subheading set up for the purpose. Thus, a U.S. Government mission sent to the field to work on economic rehabilitation could be classified 500 U.S. (Name of agency); to handle health affairs, 580 U.S. (Name of agency); to improve the agricultural output of a country, 521 U.S. (Name of Agency); to fight foot-and-mouth disease of cattle, 522.2 U.S. (Name of agency).

(11) 400.1 Intelligence activities. This includes all categories of intelligence that might affect the security of a nation, and is not restricted to military and naval intelligence.

(12) 430 Army, Navy, and Air Force Equipment and Supplies. The subheadings under this number should not be confused with their equivalent non-military classifications. For example, 430.1 includes the manufacture of all types of military and naval equipment and supplies, and should be kept distinct from 550 and its sub-divisions; 430.2 includes the construction of Army, Navy, and Air Force ships, vessels and aircraft, and should not be confused with 553.3. Classification 430.6 refers only to military commissaries, and should not be confused with non-military commissaries at Foreign Service post in 123.8.

(13) 430.2 Army, Naval, and Air Force ships, vessels, aircraft. The treatment of hospital ships in this section is restricted to the construction and other phases listed. For actual use of hospital ships in wartime and attendant negotiations, see 321.7.

(14) 550 Manufacturing. Manufactures. Subject classes 551-559 refer to manufactured products. For raw materials, see 521, 522, and 523. When possible, manufactured products should be classified under the commodity groups into which they fall, rather than under the broad material headings. The broad material headings (i.e., 555.2 Cotton manufactures, 559.4 Metal manufactures, etc.) are for the manufacture or processing of the material itself, matters relating to the industry as a whole, and commodities which are not classifiable in the commodity groups.

Examples: Classify rubber toys or plastic toys in 556.2 rather than in 552.4 or 559.76; classify slate blackboards in 554.6 rather than in 559.3; classify a report on manufacture of cotton shirts in 555.1 rather than 555.2, but classify a report on the cotton industry as a whole in 555.2.
