Subcommittee members discussed the below items:

- 1. Assessment of the FOIA Public Liaison role and determine opportunities for improvement.
 - a. Mr. Michalosky stated that the data from the FOIA Public Liaison poll is posted on the Office of Government Information Services (OGIS) website.
 - b. Ms. Barber agreed to review the results of the FOIA Public Liaison poll and take the lead on drafting a one-page synopsis of the results to share with the public. Mr. Michalosky agreed to assist Ms. Barber with this draft.
- 2. Identify current authorities for oversight and actions (program reviews, audits, reports, inspections, etc) that have been completed over the past 10 years.
 - a. Mr. Jones, Mr. Evitt, and Mr. Becker have started reviewing the numerous reports on federal agency FOIA programs that are posted to the OGIS website.
 - b. Mr. Jones and Mr. Evitt agreed to continue reviewing the reports with a focus on drafting a document that identifies trends, conclusions, or ideas for future consideration resulting from these reports.
- 3. Evaluate past litigation review efforts and determine opportunities for action.
 - a. No update was available for this item.
 - b. Mr. Michalosky stated that previous discussions around this item focused on the efforts of a project sponsored by the Transactional Records Access Clearinghouse (TRAC).
 - c. Several subcommittee members discussed the mediation role of OGIS, the appeal process prior to litigation, and the reasons for FOIA litigation.
