SOURCE: When Felix Munoz Cardenas, Third-Class Auxiliary Assistant of the Cuban Consulate in Kingston, Jamaica, returned to Kingston on 28 May 1962 from a recent trip to Cuba, he brought with him a considerable quantity of Cuban propaganda in English. I moz was met at the Palisadoes Airport by Alfonso Herrera Perdomo, the Luban Consul; Gerardo Sanchez Robert, the Cuban Commercial Attache; and Richard Hart, a well-known Jamaican Communist. Some of the printed matter brought in by Munoz was detained for inspection by the Jamaican customs officials, who made an effort to check the baggage of Munoz and two other Cuban diplomats, Agustin Yassels Gonzalez and Guillermo Salgado Alvarez, who had arrived on the plane with Munoz.² Both Herrera and Sanchez stubbornly resisted a baggage search and none was carried out. The publications and other materials were released to Herrera on 1 June. The publications brought into Jamaica by Munoz consisted of an estimated 30 to 40 copies each of sixteen different books and magazines. All were in English and had been prepared in Cuba by or on behalf of the Cuban Ministry of Foreign Affairs.
